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Hereditary Cancer Multidisciplinary Clinic



Hereditary cancer multidisciplinary clinic

- Unique clinic for TriHealth and the Greater Cincinnati area with active participation of providers from multiple specialties
- Meets the needs of patients and providers with the opportunity for patients to consult with a variety of specialties on the same visit
- Provides a more structured follow-up process for patients with identified mutations that cause high risk for cancer:
 - Identification of current management guidelines (e.g., breast MRI, earlier colonoscopy, pancreatic surveillance)
 - Better adherence to screening recommendations with regular visits with a team of specialists
 - Opportunities for research participation
 - Support in identifying and testing appropriate at-risk relatives
 - Coordination with your family doctor

What happens after a referral?

- History collected prior to visit
- Patient appointment coordinated to include consultations, labs and procedures with all providers in a single day
- Summary letter provided to patient and physician with results of all procedures/labs, outlining group consensus on management recommendations
- Follow-up visits to ensure management updates and adherence

Which specialties are participating in this clinic?

- Medical oncology
- Genetic counseling
- Surgery
- Gynecologic oncology
- Gastroenterology
- Research
- Nutrition
- Behavioral health-social work and psychology

We also have the ability to review your case with specialists in other areas when needed (for example, urology, dermatology and endocrinology).

Who can I call for more information?

Please call 513 853 1300 and ask to speak to a cancer genetic counselor about the Hereditary Cancer Multidisciplinary Clinic. Our team of genetic counselors can help determine if this is an appropriate clinic for you or your patient.

Who is eligible?

- Patients with positive mutation testing for genes associated with high cancer risk (e.g., BRCA1/2, Lynch genes, etc.)
- Patients with negative testing but with history that suggests a cancer predisposition syndrome

How to refer to this clinic
